In his speech, Agrawal beautifully explained how innovations are made keeping in mind the future needs. "Everybody wants to eat everything but nobody wants to get into farming business. Likewise everybody wants better future but nobody cares about wasting the resources we have. Innovations are needed for the things which are getting wasted," he said.

"Learning should never stop," said Nanoti, while giving examples of students who have achieved extraordinary things in their life like Shalini Kumari, Shrikant Bolla and many more. "Concern for the society and surroundings is important for innovation. Visionaries play a crucial role in motivating the demotivated students," he said.

Conducting the proceedings Abhimanyu Bhelave said, "From the beginning of civilization humans have been innovating things and ideas according to their needs. Of those the most important ancient innovation was wheel. which made life considerably easier."
