1). Introduction

Indian Museum is the oldest and largest museum of our country. Founded on 2nd February 1814 by Dr. Nathanial Wallich, a Danish Botanist, the Indian Museum is the first Museum in the Asia-Pacific region, and has played the role of a leader in setting the tone for the museum movement in the continent. In its two centuries of history, the Indian Museum, considered as the first National Museum in India, has grown enormously in terms of its collections and scope, and has now become one of the largest repository of the nation's cultural heritage. This multipurpose Institution with multidisciplinary activities is the pride of the nation being included as an Institute of National Importance in Article 62 of the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution of India. Indian Museum is visited by over 6.8 lakhs people every year.

The proposed work is for designing and recuration of selected gallery spaces of the museum. Broad objective will be to introduce modern display techniques and presentation of the artifacts, conceptualising of the galleries with emphasis on interpretation, build storyline with appropriate narrative with appropriate contextualization to achieve international standard in respect of design, display, interaction comprising Part-A: 1584 sq. m. and Part-B: 930 sq. m. totalling 2514 Sq. m., is spread over multiple halls of the museum building as detailed under para 2.1.1 below. The available space for complete curation of a new gallery measuring 702 sq.m. is provided at para 2.1.2 below.

Appropriate collaborative display of collections from related categories may also to be considered to suit broad themes/narratives.

3. Detailed Scope of Work

- a) Developing a Concept Plan: This plan will be based on a single holistic theme after taking into consideration of the available space, number & types of objects already on display and objects available in reserve collection and their context and importance in the overall theme for creating a seamless narrative which shall be applicable for all galleries under Archaeology and similarly for all galleries together for Anthropology. Complete list of objects will be made available to successful bidder. The concept plan should also incorporate aspects for making the overall presentation more interactive and to enrich visitor's experience.
- b) Creation of Sub themes: Under the aegis of the overall concept plan, different sub themes will be created based on physical space separation, timeline, availability and contextualisation of objects. The successful bidder or the agency shall provide the Concept Plan along with sub themes, space planning, list of objects for display, proposed digital interventions etc. (*Milestone 1*)
- c) Content and Storyline Development: Based upon sub themes & object selection the successful bidder shall prepare narratives on the contents for each space. This is to be

submitted in the form of a complete document detailing the content, story line, narratives etc., for approval. (Milestone 2)

- d) Gallery Design: This will include gallery layout, design/re-design of showcases/display cases/pedestals etc. after considering reuse of the available showcases and display structures, placement of showcases, placement of objects, making provisions of placement and maintenance of digital equipment, interactive kiosks, AV displays etc. and include the following:
 - Display design shall also take into account sensitivity of antiquities like temperature, humidity, security, illumination level (after considering the existing light fixtures) etc. The design shall also include formulation of appropriate content and the narratives (Wall text, Object Label, Group Label, Graphics Panel etc.) supporting all exhibits within all galleries, visitor flow patterns with preferred unidirectional entry-exit system.
 - The gallery design shall represent the overall concept, the broad theme and sub themes.
 - Design shall also include provision for deployment of state-of-the-art digital technology for content browsing, interactive immersive experiencing interpretation comprising of large multi-touch screen display, seamless video walls, AR/VR/MR applications, large screen immersive projections, 4K video displays, smart multilingual audio guides through smart phones along with content management system. It may be noted that digital interventions shall primarily be considered to supplement the museum objects and should not be overdone. The museum's antiquities should remain the primary source of attraction for the visitors. The content management system and the audio guide should have the scope of further expansion to cover the entire museum space.
 - Indian Museum is a Grade I Heritage structure. The displays and lighting should be designed considering the heritage status of the building. It should detail out the wiring of power cables and signal cables considering the heritage status.
 - Any other item necessary for Museum set-up and visitor's interpretation and facilitation.
- e) Drawings & Bill of Quantities: The agency (successful bidder) shall provide detailed f ready for construction drawings in both AutoCAD and pdf format along with bill of quantities with estimated cost with clear technical specifications of all materials/equipment including all digital interfaces. All raw materials, fittings, fixtures, equipment, gadgets etc. shall be of acceptable and reputed brands with proper warranty terms for execution through a separate tender. The Agency shall also submit 3-D layout and walkthrough model for all the gallery spaces to depict the final presentation, proper visualisation and for final approval. The agency shall also provide ready for print high resolution images of the graphics which are proposed and approved in the design. The bill of quantities shall also include items of work comprising refurbishing, reuse, refabrication and dismantling of unusable existing structures, wherever necessary, shifting and stacking of the dismantled structures, fittings etc. within the Indian Museum campus. Separate bill of quantities shall be submitted for the movement of all artefacts and antiquities which shall be implemented by Indian Museum through approved vendors having vast experience in similar works. However, the Agency shall provide guidelines for handling

of artwork/objects and artefacts for dismantling, temporary storage and reinstallation. The Agency shall also provide a detailed timeline for execution of the project. (*Milestone 3*)

f) Curatorial walk & Audio Guide App: The Agency (successful bidder) shall submit a plan for curatorial walk of about 90 minutes for guided visit of the gallery space. The agency shall also develop the entire content for a Mobile Audio Guide App covering around 100 selected objects of the museum. (Milestone 4)

Apart from these essential components, the agency or successful bidder is free to add more optional components, if necessary, keeping the main objective in view. However, Indian Museum reserves the right to modify the plan by adding, excluding or changing the content or mode of presentation of the proposed components at the time of implementation.

- g) The agency shall guide the fabricators of the galleries when the fabrication actually starts. Day-to-day supervision is not expected from the agency but the overall guidance shall be required. (*Milestone 5*)
- 4. <u>Estimated Cost</u>: The Estimated cost of the work is Rs. 50.00 (fifty) lakh including GST.

5. <u>Timeline</u>:

The work shall be completed within **3 (three) months** from date of issue of Letter of Acceptance (LOA).

6. Eligibility Criteria

Bidders fulfilling the following minimum criteria shall only be considered:

Individual, Limited Company/Corporation, Proprietary Firm, Partnership, Consortium or Joint Venture are allowed to bid for the work. Company/Firm/Consortium/Partnership firm/Individual shall have the experience of academic, technical and financial capabilities on the lines mentioned below.

- a) Experience The bidder should have a minimum of 5 years' experience in executing interpretation/ museum works, having handled projects related to Heritage and Culture at International/ National / State level and must have accomplished at least 3 Heritage/ Culture related interpretation projects. The bidders shall submit copies of work orders and completion certificates to substantiate the claim.
- b) The bidder should have past experience of designing and curating one museum gallery space of at least **15,000 sq. feet in the last five years**. Certified copies of completion certificate clearly indicating the area of gallery space curated shall be required to substantiate the claim.
- c) Financial soundness The applicant should have:
 - i) PAN and GST registration

- ii) Average Turnover of at least Rs. 50.00 lakh in last 3 years (In case of Consortium, Rs. 35.00 Lakh for lead partner and total of Rs. 50.00 lakh for the entire consortium)
- iii) The Bidder should have completed the similar works during the last 5 years from the date of the issue of this tender as per the details given below.

One similar work of value not less than Rs. 40 lakh **or** Two similar works each of value not less than Rs. 25 lakh **or** Three similar works each of value not less than **20 lakh**.

Notes:

- Here **similar work** shall mean conceptualization, planning, curation, content development, designing of gallery spaces and submission of detailed estimates with technical specifications.
- In the case of Consortium/JV participating in this tender, the works of any of the individual members of the Consortium/JV done independently will be considered as valid work experience.
- If any bidder has executed the similar work as a part of a consortium/JV in the past then the work experience of the bidder shall be considered as valid only if all the consortium/JV partners are participating together in the present tender also.
- The details of qualifying works/projects shall be furnished as per the proforma in **Annexure-I** and if required, the bidder shall also facilitate inspection of the above qualifying project(s) by NCSM's officials to ascertain the performance of the bidder.
- Documents Required: The bidder should submit a copy/copies of the work order(s) issued in the name of the agency as well as copies of work completion certificate of the same work, clearly indicating the value of the work of similar nature. If the work order contains several works, only the value of the works of a similar nature shall be considered for work experience. If the value of the works of similar nature is not specifically mentioned in the cost breakup, the work experience against that work order will not be considered as valid.
- d) Technical Expertise- The bidder should have associated/employed panel of expert(s) having following qualifications:
 - i) Project team members should have a recognized degree/diploma in Design/Architecture/Fine Arts.
- ii) Expert in the fields of object categories as given in Para 2.4 of this tender document with vast experience in curation of galleries.
- iii) Graphic designer, technology experts (hardware & software) and content writer shall have past experience in doing similar nature of work.
- iv) The bidders shall be advised to present a Proof of Concept (PoC) at the stage of technical bid presentation.

7. <u>Instructions to Bidders</u>

- a) Mode of Tendering: e-Tendering through Central Public Procurement Portal (CPPP)
- b) Validity of Bids: 120 (one hundred and twenty) days from the date of opening of tender.
- c) The tenders are invited under two bid system i.e. Technical Bid and Financial Bid.
- d) The bidder may submit a Bid Security Declaration Form as per Annexure D EMD exemption as per extant Rules/Regulations shall also be applicable.
- e) The successful Bidder will have to deposit a **Performance Security Deposit** by demand draft or e-transfer directly to the Indian Museum Trustee Account for a sum of Rs. 1,50,000/- (Rupees One Lakh Fifty Thousand only) or 3% (three percent) of the contact value whichever is lower, within 15 days of the receipt of the formal order or Letter of Acceptance (LOA). There shall be no exemption of Performance Security Deposit for MSME or other similar organisations.
- f) All entries in the tender form should be legible and filled clearly. If the space for furnishing of information is insufficient, a separate sheet may be attached. No overwriting or cutting is permitted in the Financial Bid Form and in such cases, the tender shall be summarily rejected. However, the cuttings/overwriting, if any, in the Technical Bid Application must be signed by the person authorized to sign the tender bids.
- g) The Technical Bid shall be opened first on the scheduled date and time, in the office of National Council of Science Museums. The Technical Bids shall be evaluated by a Tender Committee. Financial Bids of technically qualified, eligible bidders, meeting all the requisite criteria only shall be opened on a date and place to be notified later in presence of technically qualified Bidders or their authorized representatives.
- h) The bidder shall submit the **Technical & Financial bids** as per the format enclosed at **Annexure B & C. Bids not as per above format will be summarily rejected.**Bidder should prepare and submit Technical & Financial Bids as per specified CPPP file format.
- This office shall not be responsible for any damages, losses, claims, financial or other injury to any person deployed by the Agency (successful bidder) during the course of their performing the functions/ duties or for any payment towards any compensation whatsoever.

In case of the work is carried out in phases, total payment admissible will be computed on a pro-rata basis based on the completed floor area of gallery space vis-à-vis total floor area of gallery space under consideration.

9. Terms & Conditions of the Contract:

A General:

- 1. The bidder shall abide by the details furnished by it to this office, while submitting the tender or at any subsequent stage. In case any of the documents furnished by it is found to be false at any stage, it would be deemed to be a breach of terms of contract, making the bidder liable for legal action besides the termination / cancellation of contract, legal action for damages at the sole discretion of the Director General, National Council of Science Museums and in such eventuality, the Performance Security Deposit shall be liable to be forfeited.
- 2. The bidder shall not be allowed to transfer, assign, pledge or sub-contract its rights and liabilities under this contract to any other agency without the prior written consent of this Office.
- 3. Financial bids of only those bidders who are declared technically qualified shall be further evaluated by the Technical Evaluation Committee.
- 4. The Office of Director General, National Council of Science Museums (NCSM), Kolkata reserves the right to terminate the contract by giving one month's notice.
- 5. Failure by the bidder to comply with any statutory requirements and/or the terms of the agreement during the period of contract will result in termination of the contract and subsequent disqualification from participation in any future tender of the department.

B. Fraud and Corrupt Practices:

1. The bidder and their respective officers, employees, agents and advisers shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the Bidding Process. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, this Office (NCSM) may reject any application without being liable in any manner whatsoever to the applicant if it determines that the applicant has, directly or indirectly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt practice, fraudulent practice, coercive practice, undesirable practice or restrictive practice in the bidding Process.

2. Without prejudice to the rights of this Office under Clause (1) herein above, if a bidder is found by this Office to have directly or indirectly or through an agent, engaged or indulged in any corrupt practice, fraudulent practice, coercive practice etc.

C. Legal:

- 1. The bidder shall also be liable for depositing all taxes, levies, cess, etc. on account of service rendered by it to concerned tax collection authorities from the time to time as per extant rules and regulations on the matter.
- 2. The bidder shall maintain all statutory registers under the applicable laws. The bidder shall produce the same, on demand, to the concerned authority of this Office or any other authority under Law.

iii. Financial Bid Evaluation

- a) The Financial Bids of the technically qualified bidders will be opened online through CPP Portal.
- b) The bidder with the lowest financial bid (L1) will be awarded the work.
- c) During financial evaluation, the evaluation committee shall go through the rates quoted for each item and adjudge their reasonability and workability. The rates which are found to be unworkable will be treated as unresponsive and the corresponding bid will be liable for rejection.

In the event the Financial Bids are the same for two or more bidders, the bidder securing the higher technical score will be declared as the Best Value Bidder for award of the Project.

F. Others

- 1. All disputes arising out of this contract shall be subject to the jurisdiction of Courts of Kolkata. However, no dispute shall be taken by either of the parties to the contract, to any court of law without first referring it to an Arbitrator, who will be appointed by the Director General, National Council of Science Museums, Kolkata.

Conceptualization, planning, curation/re-curation, content development, designing of gallery spaces by using new cabinets/retrofitting the existing cabinets & pedestals to the extent possible and submission of detailed estimates with technical specifications for the specified galleries at Indian Museum, Kolkata.

Detailed Scope of Work

- a) Developing a Concept Plan: This plan will be based on a single holistic theme after taking into consideration of the available space, number & types of objects already on display and objects available in reserve collection and their context and importance in the overall theme for creating a seamless narrative which shall be applicable for all galleries under Archaeology and similarly for all galleries together for Anthropology. Complete list of objects will be made available to successful bidder. The concept plan should also incorporate aspects for making the overall presentation more interactive and to enrich visitor's experience.
- b) Creation of Sub themes: Under the aegis of the overall concept plan, different sub themes will be created based on physical space separation, timeline, availability and contextualisation of objects. The successful bidder or the agency shall provide the Concept Plan along with sub themes, space planning, list of objects for display, proposed digital interventions etc. (*Milestone 1*)
- c) Content and Storyline Development: Based upon sub themes & object selection the successful bidder shall prepare narratives on the contents for each space. This is to be submitted in form of a complete document detailing the content, story line, narratives etc., for approval. (*Milestone 2*)
- d) Gallery Design: This will include gallery layout, design/re-design of showcases/display cases/pedestals etc. after considering reuse of the available showcases and display structures, placement of showcases, placement of objects, making provisions of placement and maintenance of digital equipment, interactive kiosks, AV displays etc. and include the following:
 - Display design shall also take into account sensitivity of antiquities like temperature, humidity, security, illumination level (after considering the existing light fixtures) etc. The design shall also include formulation of appropriate content and the narratives (Wall text, Object Label, Group Label, Graphics Panel etc.) supporting all exhibits within all galleries, visitor flow patterns with preferred unidirectional entry-exit system.
 - The gallery design shall represent the overall concept, the broad theme and sub themes.
 - Design shall also include provision for deployment of state-of-the-art digital technology for content browsing, interactive immersive experiencing interpretation comprising of large multi-touch screen display, seamless video walls, AR/VR/MR applications, large screen immersive projections, 4K video displays, smart multilingual audio guides through smart phones along with content management system. It may be noted that digital interventions shall primarily be considered to supplement the museum objects and should not be overdone. The museum's antiquities should

remain the primary source of attraction for the visitors. The content management system and the audio guide should have the scope of further expansion to cover the entire museum space.

- Indian Museum is a Grade I Heritage structure. The displays and lighting should be designed considering the heritage status of the building and with minimum interventions on the building. It should detail out the wiring of power cables and signal cables considering the heritage status.
- Any other item necessary for Museum set-up and visitor's interpretation and facilitation.
- e) Drawings & Bill of Quantities: The agency (successful bidder) shall provide detailed f ready for construction drawings in both AutoCAD and pdf format along with bill of quantities with estimated cost with clear technical specifications of all materials/equipment including all digital interfaces. All raw materials, fittings, fixtures, equipment, gadgets etc. shall be of acceptable and reputed brands with proper warranty terms for execution through a separate tender. The Agency shall also submit 3-D layout and walkthrough model for all the gallery spaces to depict the final presentation, proper visualisation and for final approval. The agency shall also provide ready for print high resolution images of the graphics which are proposed and approved in the design. The bill of quantities shall also include items of work comprising refurbishing, reuse, refabrication and dismantling of unusable existing structures, wherever necessary, shifting and stacking of the dismantled structures, fittings etc. within the Indian Museum campus. Separate bill of quantities shall be submitted for the movement of all artefacts and antiquities which shall be implemented by Indian Museum through approved vendors having vast experience in similar works. However, the Agency shall provide guidelines for handling of artwork/objects and artefacts for dismantling, temporary storage and reinstallation. The Agency shall also provide a detailed timeline for execution of the project. (Milestone 3)
- f) Curatorial walk & Audio Guide App: The Agency (successful bidder) shall submit a plan for curatorial walk of about 90 minutes for guided visit of the gallery space. The agency shall also develop the entire content for a Mobile Audio Guide App covering around 100 selected objects of the museum. (*Milestone 4*)
 - Apart from these essential components, the agency or successful bidder is free to add more optional components, if necessary, keeping the main objective in view. However, Indian Museum reserves the right to modify the plan by adding, excluding or changing the content or mode of presentation of the proposed components at the time of implementation.
- g) The agency shall guide the fabricators of the galleries when the fabrication actually starts. Day-to-day supervision is not expected from the agency but the overall guidance shall be required. (*Milestone 5*)

The bidders are requested to visit Indian Museum, Kolkata, inspect the galleries to understand the requirement and assess the site conditions.
